Reducing your waste paint



Paint

Around 150 million litres of paint is sold for DIY projects every year and it is estimated that about 25% of this is not used.

Newry and Mourne District Council are urging residents to plan carefully when starting to decorate rooms/houses to reduce wastage, while saving money.



Handy tips

Always remember:

Only buy the amount you need

There are now a number of paint calculators available on the internet to help you estimate the amount of paint you will need.

Think of the environment

Use water based/ Low Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) paints (emulsion) which are less harmful to the environment, have less toxic fumes.

Seal and store paint properly

Make sure you have an air tight seal to keep the paint fresh until you're ready to use it again; clean the rim of the can and stretch cling film over the opening, replace the lid securely .

Use up any leftover paint

If you find you only have a small amount of paint left apply another coat to an area which could use extra protection. Newly leftover paint can be used for touch-up jobs and smaller projects such as stencilling. Be creative! You can blend and mix smaller quantities of emulsion to use on non critical jobs or as primer on larger jobs.

Beware of old paint (including lead based) which are often stored incorrectly and may be unsuitable for reuse.

Offer any leftover paint to friends, family or local community groups

If you can't use your leftover paint and are unable to store it, consider donating it to community groups, schools, churches or others who may need or want it. Paint will only keep for a few years.

Recycle and dispose of properly as a last resort

To tie in with planned changes for the Civic Amenity Sites, from the 1st November 2009, Newry and Mourne Council will only take paint tins at a reduced number of their Civic Amenity Sites (Please see reverse for details). Householders will only be allowed to take 10 litres of paint per visit to these sites.

Recycling Metal Paint Tins

You can recycle all metal paint tins at any of our 7 Civic Amenity Sites (CAS).

Please ensure you follow these simple steps:

- Make sure the tin is made from metal
- Make sure there is no liquid paint inside and that the tin is dry on the inside (For paint residue in the tin, remove the lid and allow to dry completely. Remove the skin.
- Place the empty paint tin in the scrap metal bin.

Unfortunately, we are unable to recycle empty plastic paint tins, however you can place these in the general waste skips.

Please ensure tins are completely empty . Leave the lid off so the attendants can see that the paint has gone.
